June Theme:

Father's Day, Plants and Summer

This month, we will finish up our animal unit by creating 3-D animal sculpture out of plasticine! We will continue to work on our writing. Students are expanding from one sentence to at least three sentences during Writer's Workshop! In math we will be learning about measuring and comparing length and weight. We will also be learning more about addition and subtraction.

We will also be talking about summer weather and clothing changes, as well as water safety and fun!

And, of course, we will be celebrating all of the things we love about DAD!



As the year comes to a close, we will continue to work with the alphabet, recognizing upper and lower case letters, making lists of familiar words, printing words and sentences. If you are practicing your printing at home, please remind your child about proper finger positioning on the pencil and that we always start printing from the top and work our way down. We will continue to practice reading and our sight words as well as sequencing stories, telling stories by looking at an illustration and drawing a picture of a story (comprehension).

Other math skills we are continually working on are counting to 100 by 1's, 2's, 5's and 10's. We are also beginning to add single digit numbers to 10 and working on number recognition to 20, one-to-one correspondence to 15, rote counting to 30, printing numbers to 20 and comparing and graphing sets of objects using words like same, less, more, the most and the least. We will play fun number games like dominoes, number bingo and match the number to reinforce number recognition.
