## November Theme:

## Colors, Shapes, Letters and Numbers



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We are finishing up our apples and fall theme and starting our color/shape theme. We will learn new poems and have a variety of "color days" dedicated to ten of the colors.
Beginning Monday November 9th, students will be asked to wear a specific color to go along with our theme. The color days for this month will be:

Nov. $9^{\text {th }}$ : Orange
Nov. $10^{\text {th }}$ : Red
Nov. 12 ${ }^{\text {th }}$ : Yellow
Nov. 13 ${ }^{\text {th }}$ : Green
Nov. 16 ${ }^{\text {th }}$ : Blue
Nov. $17^{\text {th }}$ : Purple
Nov. 18 ${ }^{\text {th }}$ : Pink
Nov. 19 ${ }^{\text {th }}$ : Brown
Nov. 20 ${ }^{\text {st }}$ : Black/White
In Math, we will keep working with patterns and numbers. Along with our calendar-related activities (number recognition, predicting what comes next, counting forwards and backwards, skip counting, associating numbers with quantities), we will also be doing some graphing, estimating, and continuing to practice printing our numbers to 5 .

Letters will be another focus for the students this month. We will be learning a letter a day (or every few days), working on recognition, what begins with the particular letter and the sound. I will also be introducing the students to the "Handwriting Without Tears" program. The students are going to learn little songs as well to help remember the letters. Please ask your child to share those songs with you!

Please do not forget about the new Show \& Tell beginning Monday November $9^{\text {th }}$.

## Home Assistance

What can you do at home to assist your child in his/ her first year of school?

1) Help your child to print his / her first name using an initial capital letter, followed by lower case letters. E.g.James.
2) Practice tying shoe laces and getting their coats on and zipped up on their own. Come winter time, when everyone has boots and snow gear those skills will save us a lot of time.
3) Look through the library books your child chooses from school. Have him/ her tell you about the colours and numbers of objects, or tell a story using the pictures as clues.
4) Continue to read daily with and to your child and practice math skills such as counting.

## A Few House-Keeping Items:

- In order for parents to help/volunteer in the classroom or on field trips, please remember to stop by the office to initiate a criminal record check. The new policy is that this Criminal Record Check has to be fully completed (sent by the office and returned to GME cleared by the RCMP) before you can help in class or take part in field trips.
